Edward Kennedy was born in Belfast, Northern Ireland where he commenced learning the cornet with his father at the age of eight. He joined Ireland's premier "A" Grade band the 1st Old Boys Association Brass Band, eventually progressing through the ranks to the principal cornet position, which he held for many years.

In 1986 Edward migrated to Brisbane, Australia and joined the South Brisbane Federal Band on principal cornet, which at the time was directed by his brother John Kennedy.

In 1988 Edward moved to Toowoomba in Queensland to take up a position with Education Queensland as a multi Instrumental Music Teacher. During this time he accepted an invitation to start a new Junior Band for the Toowoomba Municipal Band. Today this band is still going strong and has evolved into a successful "C" Grade band. In 1991 Edward was appointed as Musical Director of the Toowoomba Municipal Senior Band where he enjoyed considerable success developing the band from "C" Grade to winning the Queensland Championship "B" Grade outright in 1994.

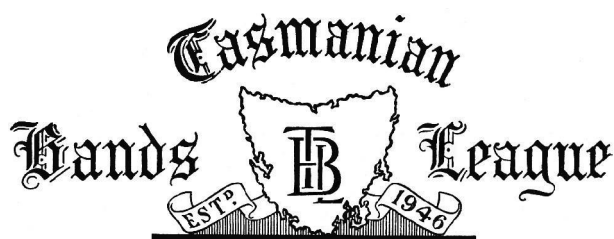
In 1995 he moved back to Brisbane and once again played principal cornet for the South Brisbane Federal Band. Within two years Edward was invited to take up the role of Musical Director with the band. Over the next decade the band enjoyed a very successful period under his direction, including winning various Queensland and National Banding events.

As a cornet player Edward has been Queensland Champion on many occasions and Queensland's Champion of Champions on two occasions. However, Edward's biggest achievement on the cornet was winning the British Open Bb Cornet Title in 2006 while studying for his Masters Degree in conducting with the legendary Professor David King at Salford University, Manchester, U.K. from 2005 until 2007.

During this period of study in the U.K. Edward also played cornet with various English Bands, including YBS, Besses, Hepworth, Mount Charles; and also the Leyland Band in their winning performance at the 2005 British National Band Championships in the Royal Albert Hall.

Since returning to Australia in October 2007, Edward recommenced his service with Education Queensland as a Senior Instrumental Teacher in Brisbane, where he teaches brass, woodwind and percussion as well as directing several concert bands and jazz bands.

Over the last twenty years Edward has become highly respected in Australia as a music educator, conductor, performer, adjudicator, clinician, composer and arranger.
